Bi-monthly Newsletter

Welcome to the North East Gambling-Related Harms programme newsletter. We are working to develop a regional approach to tackle the harm caused by gambling across our region.

Since the last newsletter, we have submitted multiple responses as a region to consultations run by the Gambling Commission on socially responsible incentives and customer-led tools. Additionally, the <u>Make Every Contact Count</u> (MECC) webpage has been updated for gambling harms to include additional support services. Our first pilot is also beginning with Newcastle University on a gambling harms wellbeing module, with hopes that learning from this can be shared with other education hubs in the North East. Great work is happening within our local authorities too, examples include health needs assessments underway or near completion, engaging with wider stakeholders to run workshops on gambling harms and rolling out surveys to improve our local data and knowledge on gambling harms in our communities.

NECA Treatment Provider

NECA Gambling Services provide free, confidential advice and support for individuals affected by gambling related harms in the North East. Support is tailored to the individual's needs throughout their recovery journey, with opportunities for one to one and group support. NECA will work in partnership with local services and facilitate referrals, where appropriate, to best meet the needs of the individual. Appointments are available face to face across a range of locations in the region, virtually and via telephone. Referrals can be made by professionals or those affected by gambling related harms via several referral routes.

You can contact the NECA Gambling Hub on 0191 562 3309 or access referral forms <u>here</u>. Once a referral is received, a member of the team will be in touch within 48 hours to discuss tailored support options. NECA also provide free awareness training for local services and businesses, to raise awareness of gambling related harms and referral pathways.
