New rules boosting safety and consumer choice

The Gambling Commission have announced changes to increase safety and customer choice. Changes include the option to 'opt-in' to direct marketing, rather than automatically receiving it and strengthening age verification in premises to anyone who appears under 25 rather than under 21. GamLEARN are a lived experience network for people that have been impacted directly or indirectly from gambling related harm. They are a member focused charity, providing members with opportunities to obtain learning and accredited training. They also offer a support service for individuals facing the criminal justice system as a result of gambling. Additionally, they run monthly online meet-ups for their members.
